
# **Welcome to Quenington**



We are delighted that you have chosen to come and live in our lovely and historic Cotswold village. This pack is distributed by Quenington Parish Council to help you settle in and find your way around the local area.

# **Brief History of the Village**

Quenington is situated in the attractive Coln Valley some nine miles east of Cirencester. The village, mentioned in the Domesday Book, has important medieval remains. The richly carved north and south doorways of St Swithin Church possibly date back to 1140, or even earlier, and the gateways near the church, are the site of the Preceptory of the Knights Hospitaller. The land was given by the de Lacey family to the Order in c.1190's.

The part of the village that lies along the river Coln, a tributary of the Thames, is adjacent to an area designated as being of Outstanding Natural Beauty. Over half the village is in a conservation area and there are many attractive walks in the vicinity.

Today the village has some 600 inhabitants and about 250 dwellings.

# **Quenington Parish Council**

Quenington Parish Council is the first level of local government and is a point of contact for any community issues. Parish councillors are elected by the local community every 4 years and administration is carried out by the Clerk. There are six scheduled meetings a year on the second Thursday of the month commencing in January. The meetings are held in Quenington Village Hall at 7.30pm and residents are encouraged to join the meetings as there is an "open" section at the start and end of the meeting when any relevant issues can be raised. The parish may have up to seven elected councillors. **Quenington Parish Plan:** Parish Plans are community led plans that set out a vision for the future of the parish. The Quenington Parish Action Plan was prepared in order to meet two objectives:

- To involve residents in the development of their own community by bringing about those small improvements that residents feel are necessary to enhance or maintain the quality of life we live here.
- To carry weight with local authorities when formulating policy which may affect us and with funding organisations to which we may apply for grants.

### **Emergency Defibrillator**

An emergency defibrillator is located at the village hall on the outside wall, near the front entrance. This should only be removed/used on instruction from the ambulance service AFTER dialling 999.

If you not confident in the use of a defibrillator, local trained volunteers are available to help by dialling the village emergency number 01285 610210. There is also a defibrillator in the old telephone kiosk opposite Coln Stores in Coln St Aldwyns.

#### **Quenington Village Hall**

#### **Shops**

The nearest shop is the Coln Stores in Coln St Aldwyns, it has a wide range of food and useful products and also includes a post office and popular café. It is a Community Shop, so many of the staff are volunteers – if you are

There are two local supermarkets in Fairford, the Co-op and Londis and a selection of cafés and other small shops. The nearest large supermarkets and shops are in Cirencester.

Markets are held in Fairford on Wednesday morning and Cirencester on Mondays and Fridays. There is a Farmers' Market in Cirencester on two Saturday mornings a month.

#### **Playground**

The playground is located off the village green, accessed from Snake Drive which runs past the car park for Greenview bungalows. There is a range of play equipment, a hard surfaced basketball area and a grass kickabout area with goals.

#### **Rubbish Collection**

Rubbish is collected by Cotswold District Council (01285 623000/ www.cotswold.gov.uk) on Fridays; food waste is collected weekly (small black bin) and all other waste and recycling is collected fortnightly. Garden waste is collected in the green bin and costs £47 per year (from April), payable to the Cotswold District Council

Other rubbish, which includes general non-recyclable waste (in black bin), paper & glass (in separate black boxes), cardboard (in blue bag), and cartons, plastics & cans (in white bag). Old clothes, shoes, batteries and small electricals can also be left out for collection.

Changes to collections due to Bank Holidays are displayed on the Village Green noticeboard and Cotswold District Council website.

The nearest Household Recycling Centre is at Fosse Cross (GL54 4NW), which is open daily apart from Tuesdays.

#### **Local Bus services**

## Communications

The village has high speed broadband provided through the FASTERSHIRE scheme. You can order your landline / telephone / broadband from any of the major suppliers.

Mobile phone coverage within the village is poor but plans are underway to install a telecommunications mast just outside the village, which will improve the situation. Most of the major network suppliers have products that provide mobile phone reception within your home through your broadband service.
